The purpose of the seminar is to provide speech-language pathologists (SLPs) with information they can use with classroom teachers to help them appreciate the complex nature of language disorders and their impact upon academic learning. This seminar will provide a pre-packaged in-service prototype for SLPs to use and modify in their unique settings. It will focus on discourse scaffolding techniques which are more effective for language and academic learning and which are evidenced-based. The presentation will demonstrate ways in which teachers can support learning for students with LLD by providing supportive discourse scaffolds during instruction. Supplementary materials including handouts and outlines that summarize follow-up activities will link instructional and content area learning and will help facilitate communication between SLPs and classroom teachers across the grades.

Children with speech and language disorders often do not achieve their maximum potential within the classroom setting. They fail because they cannot follow the teachers' directions, retain information, ask questions, respond, etc. Students' performance can be improved if teachers modify their own communication during instructional interactions. This session presents a model of service delivery where the SLP coaches teachers on how to modify their instructional communication. Practical tools for coaching are shared.

Linking Phonology and Language: Approaches, Target Selection and Intervention Ideas

This presentation will first, discuss selected contemporary approaches for the treatment of sound production errors, including pattern-based approaches and contrast-based interventions (i.e. therapies that build upon the concept of phonological contrast). The following treatment approaches are included 1) pattern-based approaches, including the cycles approach, 2) phonotactic therapy, 3) minimal pair therapy, and 4) the multiple opposition approach. The second portion of this presentation will include ways to link phonological treatment to the development of vocabulary while the third portion includes pairing the treatment of sound difficulties with morphology. Practical examples will be provided throughout the session.
